Moment of Calm

Our school vision embraces the spiritual, physical, intellectual, emotional, moral and social development of children. We believe that spiritual development is a core thread that runs through our school, and we see it as vital for the flourishing of all within our school community. In order to provide the children with additional opportunities for spiritual development, we have introduced a 'moment of CALM' each day.

The moment involves stillness - appreciation - reflection and/or prayer. When the children return from lunch, they will enter the classroom to quiet music playing and an image or quote displayed on the board to spark their curiosity and they are invited to reflect upon it for 3-5 minutes. We will explore our school values and Big Ideas, prompting the children to reflect on these. This moment of calm will also help them settle back into the classroom after play-time and give them a quiet space in their busy day.

This week in Nursery we had a magical week diving into the story of Jack and the Beanstalk! The children loved retelling the story using repetitive phrases, changing parts of the plot with their own ideas, and even pretending to be giants—“Fee fi fo fum!”

We also planted our very own beans and are excited to see how tall they’ll grow! In maths, we explored shapes and used lots of describing words like pointy, round, straight, and corner. With the sunny weather, we’ve been learning all about sun safety—why it’s important to wear sun cream and a hat, and why we need to stay in the shade during the hottest part of the day. We also discovered how the sun helps both plants grow, and used its rays to make beautiful sun prints on cyanotype paper using flowers and leaves. 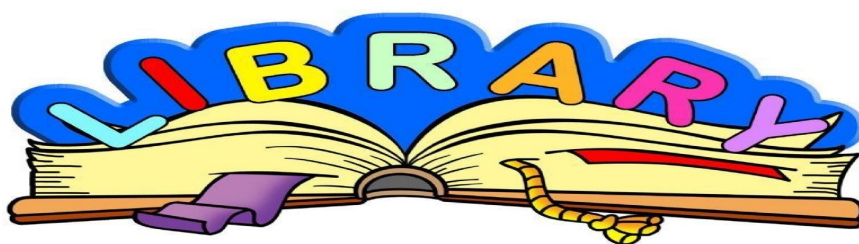

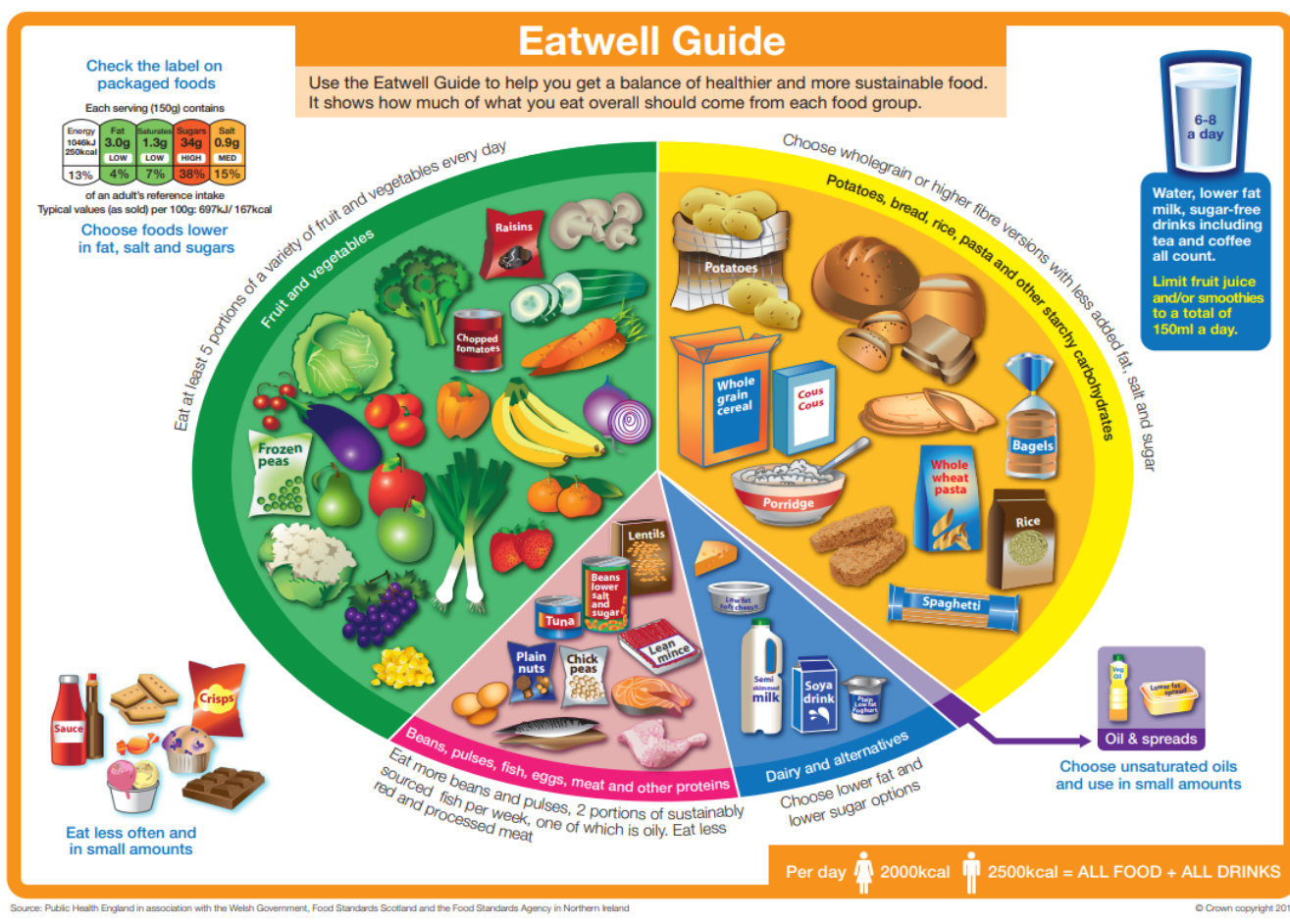


Healthy Schools

Over the past few weeks, the children have been discussing in class what should be included in a healthy packed lunch. This follows on from our work this year on educating the children on healthy choices and learning from nutrition specialists visiting school. Following our parents survey earlier in the year around packed lunches and discussions with the children in class, we have created some packed lunch guidance. This guidance is to help packed lunches be as healthy as school meals which meet the School Food Standards and is based on the Eatwell Guide, produced by Public Health England.

Please see the packed lunch guidance that has been sent out with the newsletter. We will also be sending out information over the next few weeks to help support implementing the guidance. Please see some low cost ideas for packed lunches attached this week.

We appreciate all children are different and some children may have medical conditions or sensory issues around food that make it difficult to follow all of the guidance. In this case, parents are urged to be responsible for ensuring that packed lunches are as healthy as possible. Please discuss this with Mrs West if you have any concerns around your child's packed lunch. We appreciate your support in implementing this guidance so everyone in school can benefit from a healthy meal.
