Life in Reception

This week we have been building our hearts, minds and bodies in Reception. We thought about special places and after a virtual visit to a mosque, went to see Father Marius at Holy Trinity church. We thought about all the similarities and differences and what made these places so very special. Can you think of somewhere that is special to you? How do you feel in that place? We also had a tooth workshop. Taking care of our bodies is so important! We talked about brushing our teeth regularly and properly so that we can crunch and munch to our heart's delight! We have been so very busy, we have to take a good rest over the half term!

In Literacy we have been learning about rhyming. Sometimes it can be a little tricky to find words that rhyme because lots of words sound similar but they don't rhyme. We definitely found this a little challenging, so keep practising at home and we will revisit it next term! Why doesn't 'play' rhyme with 'cake'? Why doesn't 'orange' rhyme with 'octopus'? They have other similarities but they don't rhyme.

When we come back we will be talking about what makes a superhero super? What is a hero anyway? We will be describing different super hero characters and creating our own superhero passports. What makes you super? Can you think of any real-life superheroes in history? Or present day? Are there any grown-ups you can think of that do special things for you? Maybe you could make a fact-file about them to present to the class when we come back?

Ms Moulder's real life superhero is a woman called Jane Goodall. She worked really hard to help the environment and learn all about chimpanzees. There is wonderful video of her releasing a chimp into the wild and how grateful the chimp was... it even gave her a hug!

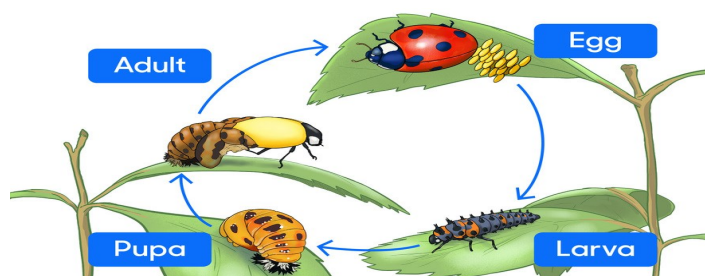


Nursery News

**“Grandma, what big teeth you have!”
– “All the better to eat with!”**

This week, the children have had lots of fun diving into the story of Little Red Riding Hood! We’ve been reading the tale together and acting out different parts of the story – the children really enjoyed bringing the characters to life. Alongside our story time, we’ve been learning all about oral health. We were lucky to have a special visitor from Guy’s and St Thomas’ Dental Hospital who taught us why brushing our teeth is so important. The children learned that they should brush twice a day for at least two minutes, and how eating healthy, low-sugar foods helps keep our teeth strong.

Ask your child what they remember – they’ve picked up some great facts and tips! (We’ve also attached a helpful information sheet for parents about oral health.) In the garden, we’ve been continuing to explore the life cycle of ladybirds. The children were so excited to find lots of tiny eggs on our biggest tree in the garden – nature in action!



We wish all our families a lovely, restful half-term break. When we return, we’ll be diving into more traditional tales, including Jack and the Beanstalk and Jasper’s Beanstalk and watch this space as there are lots of events scheduled already, such as EYFS festival, Sports Day, EYFS Assembly and more .
