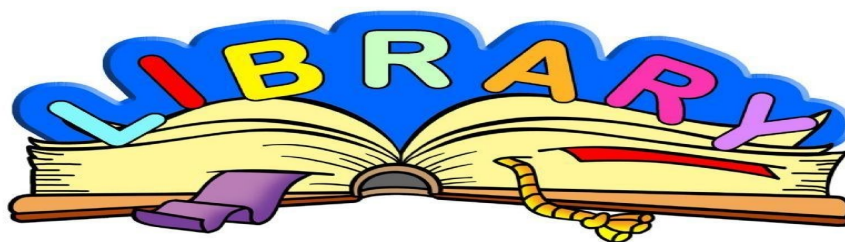
Well done to St. Patrick's House who came out on top again with 99 house points! To all of our families celebrating Eid, we wish you a wonderful and blessed weekend.

We would like to update you on the exciting developments with our school library. We are fortunate to have been offered a place on the Libraries for Primaries project, this entails being given 500 brand new books, soft furnishings and training for our library staff. We are also hugely grateful for all of you who contributed towards the Usborne and Scholastic Bookfairs, which raised nearly £1000 worth of free books for the school! This money has gone towards updating our non-fiction range and developing our graphic novel selection (something that we know is very important for early and reluctant readers). We are also extremely appreciative to everyone who has contributed books for birthdays as this has increased our range of fiction.

Registering all of the new books has been a lengthy process but we are nearly there! All new books will be on the library system by the end of June - thanks again for your patience. With so many beautiful, new books to add to our collection, we have decided to move the library into a larger room to make it more of an inviting and inspiring space. We will also use the new library for interventions, such as phonics, therefore we need to design a room fit for both purposes.

We are currently fundraising for circular tables and chairs, inviting rugs & seating spaces and rotating bookcases. **We are in the process of setting up an option on parent pay for you to donate to this exciting project!
