Y4 Girls' Football



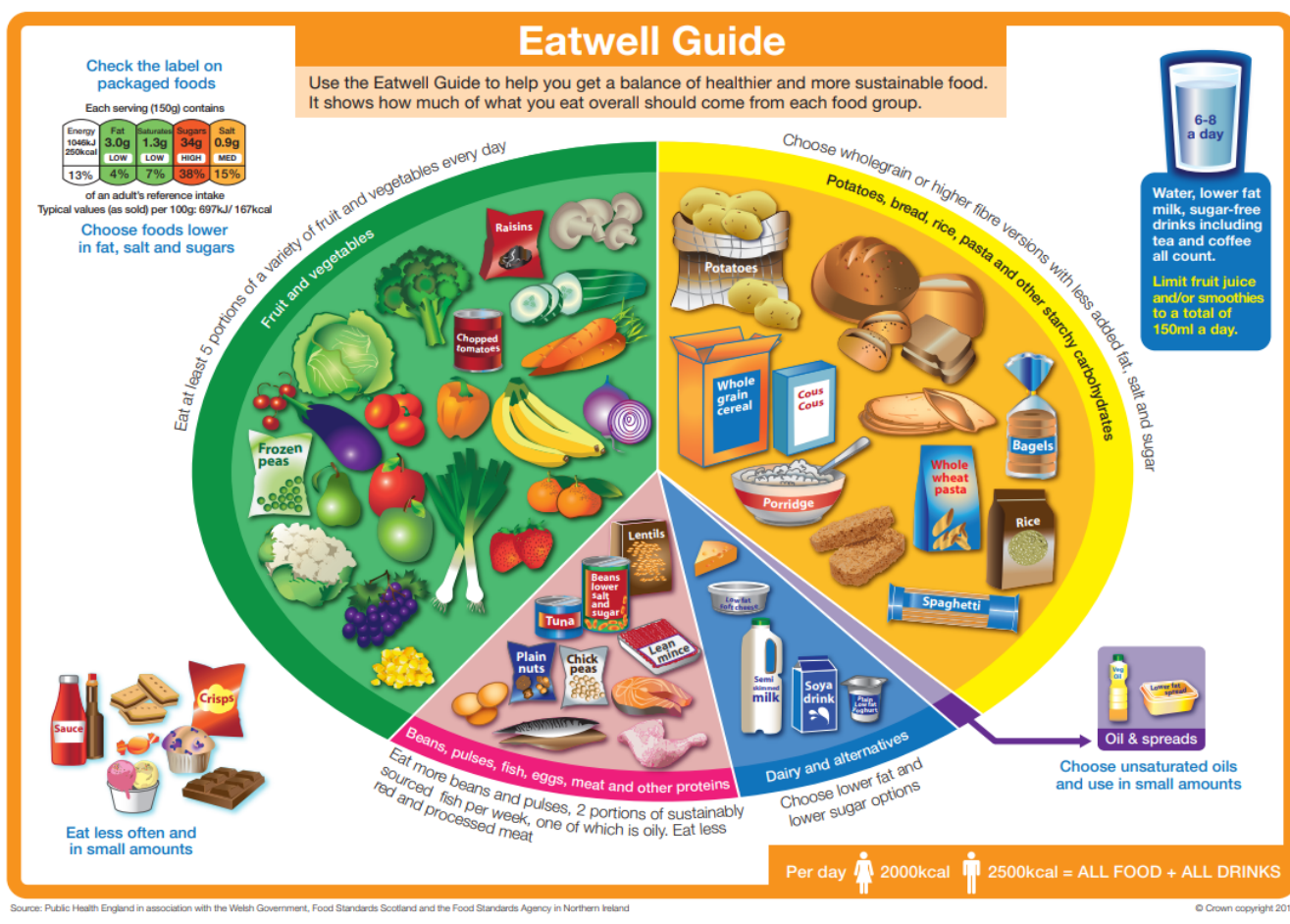
Well done to girls in Y4 who represented the school brilliantly today! They managed to get to the semi-finals before losing to a Y5 team. Great effort!

Healthy Schools

This week, the children have been discussing in class what should be included in a healthy packed lunch. This follows on from our work this year on educating the children on healthy choices and learning from nutrition specialists visiting school. Following our parents survey earlier in the year around packed lunches and discussions with the children in class, we have created some packed lunch guidance. This guidance is to help packed lunches be as healthy as school meals which meet the School Food Standards and is based on the Eatwell Guide, produced by Public Health England.

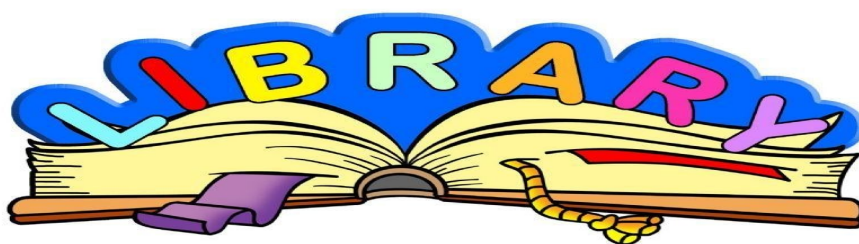

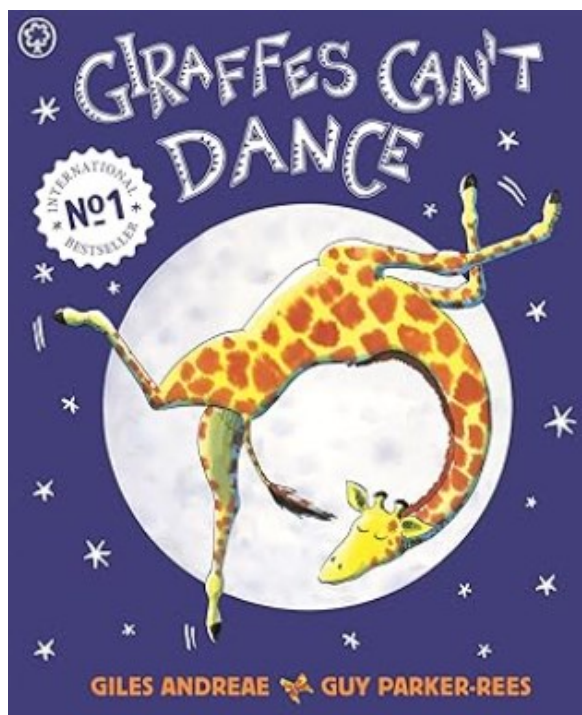
Books for Birthdays
